PGY2 Oncology Pharmacy Residency: The PGY2 Oncology Pharmacy Residency at UAB Hospital is a one-year program that prepares its graduates to serve as clinical pharmacy specialists, caring for acute and ambulatory adult hematology and oncology patients, and to facilitate as preceptors in the learning experiences of both students and residents. Graduates will be prepared to sit for the Board Certification Exam in Oncology Pharmacy upon residency completion. UAB Hospital is an academic medical center with unique opportunities to engage residents in a wide variety of practice environments and across the full spectrum of an oncology patient's care – from inpatient clinical services and ambulatory management of oral and intravenous antineoplastics to end-of-life issues in the palliative care setting.

The applicant must possess a PharmD degree and have completed an ASHP-accredited PGY1 pharmacy residency. All applications must be submitted through PhORCAS (Pharmacy Online Residency Centralized Application System) by **January 1**. The required components of the application include a letter of intent, three references, a photograph of the applicant, curriculum vitae, and a pharmacy school transcript. An on-site interview is required.
