# **Vaginal Repair Procedures**

### **Technique**

Procedure involves the repair of the walls of the vagina to prevent prolapse (protruding out of the vagina). The procedure may be called an anterior repair when fixing a cystocele or a posterior repair when repairing a rectocele.

#### **Incisions**

An incision is made in the vagina at the site of the defect for this procedure. No abdominal incisions are required.

## **Operative Time**

- Operative times vary greatly depending on the findings at the time of surgery. Your surgeon will proceed with safety as his/her priority.
- Average times range from 45-60 minutes.

#### **Anesthesia**

General anesthesia

## **Preoperative Care**

- Please do not eat anything by mouth after midnight on the day prior to the procedure.
- You may be asked to do a bowel preparation on the evening prior to your procedure.

### **Hospital Stay**

- Day surgery
- Inpatient stay for 1-2 days after the surgery

### **Postoperative Care**

- These guidelines are intended to give you a general idea of your postoperative course. Since every patient is unique and has a unique procedure, your recovery may differ.
- Anti-inflammatory pain medicine is usually required for the first several days to manage soreness and inflammation.
- Opioid pain medicine will be provided to ease the discomfort from the incisions.
- We recommend taking anti-inflammatory medications such as ibuprofen or naproxen on a schedule, only using opioid pain medicine on an "as needed" basis.
- Driving is allowed after your procedure once you no longer need the opioid medicine to manage your pain.
- Patients may return to work in 4-6 weeks following the procedure.
- Please do not put anything in the vagina for 6 weeks.

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
