• Gonal-F°: 300/450/900 unit pens or 450IU multidose vials

• Follistim[®]: 300/600/900 unit pens

Ganirelix Acetate, Cetrotide*: antagonist medications

"TRIGGER" SHOTS (HCG)

Novarel®, Ovidrel®, and Pregnyl® are human chorionic gonadotropin (HCG) medications used to "trigger" ovulation. They are used just one time, so you will only need one dosing kit. Ovidrel comes premixed in a filled syringe, so it may cost slightly more than other options that require you to mix the medication yourself.
